GEOGRAPHY

Local Geography students shine in Australian Geography Competition!

Year 11 Geography students from Denmark SHS tested their geographical skills and knowledge against students from all around Australia in the 2023 Australian Geography Competition. We recently received the results and they were outstanding.

We have a number of student geographers at our school who performed very well in the competition this year with Lara Hunter and Josie Goodwill Buczak gaining high distinctions, which puts them in the top level of all students nationwide. Several other students also excelled, receiving certificates of distinction and credit. Over 73,000 students from across Australia entered the Australian Geography Competition so the students should be very pleased with their attainment.

A really exciting aspect of this year's results is that Lara was selected as one of two students to represent WA at the Geography Big Week Out in less than a month's time! Lara will be flown to Darwin to participate in a mix of stimulating and hands-on geography activities, focusing on fieldwork, designed to challenge and extend high-performing senior students. Australia's team to the 2023 International Geography Olympiad in Ireland will be chosen from Year 11 students who excel at the Big Week Out. We wish Lara all the best in her endeavours, and because she'll be doing geography fieldwork for a week, we know she'll have a fantastic time.

The competition is a joint initiative of the Australian Geography Teachers' Association and the Royal Geographical Society of Queensland. Funding to support the Competition and Australia's team in the Olympiad is provided by the Australian Department of Education, Skills and Employment, the University of Melbourne and the University of New South Wales.



NEW BUS

We are very pleased to share that our school has taken delivery of a new Yutong D9 - 39 seater school bus with capacity to provide wheelchair access.

The new bus is fitted with a raft of safety features such as:

- Electronic Stability Control (ESC)
- Electronic Brakeforce Distribution (EBD)
- Anti-lock Braking System (ABS)
- Check-Mate Alarm system that ensures all children have safely disembarked the vehicle upon completion of each run.

For the comfort of our students on long trips, the bus is airconditioned, has a fridge and most seats are fitted with USB ports.


2023 Young Originals Exhibition


