The information in this booklet is provided in a way to make the school voluntary contributions and compulsory charges easier to understand and follow. We wish to assure you that our efforts have been directed towards keeping costs as low as possible.

In accordance with the Education Act and Regulations, schools must provide a detailed list of any possible contribution or charge that may arise during the school year. It is arranged by year group then a list of general charges are provided so that you can determine which costs are relevant to your child.

It is recommended that you take the time to read this booklet carefully so that you have a clear understanding of the contributions, charges, the Secondary Assistance Scheme and other important information. Parents at Denmark Senior High School have had a very good record of paying the voluntary contributions and compulsory charges and we look forward to the continuation of this good record and parent support for our local senior high school. The collection of these payments will enable us to continue to provide the best possible educational opportunities for students.

Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges Summary

The 2024 Voluntary Contributions and Charges information tabled for each year group details the voluntary contribution amounts that are allocated to learning areas from Year 7 to Year 10; as well as the compulsory charges for elective courses in Year 9 and Year 10.

Year 11 and 12 courses are considered post compulsory as students can attend TAFE, obtain employment or apprenticeships, and therefore all charges are considered compulsory under the Education Act Regulations.

1. Voluntary Contributions

The School is requesting a voluntary contribution of **\$235 for each Year 7 - 10** student towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by students in the educational program. These contributions will make a significant contribution to the quality of educational programs delivered. The voluntary contribution requested for Year 7 and Year 8 students will be a maximum of \$235.00.

2. Compulsory Charges

(a) **Year 9 and 10 Elective Courses** will attract a compulsory charge. For **Years 11 and 12** all charges are considered **compulsory** under the Education Act Regulations. As there is no maximum charge the school will try to keep costs to a minimum. **We reserve the right to place students into a lower cost option if the charges are not paid. This will be reviewed by Week 10 of Term 1, 2024.**

(b) **Optional activities** - Any course where there is a high cost associated with the provision of the course – e.g. excursions, camps, specific higher cost materials, competitions, outdoor education, etc.

(c) **Other optional school-based activities** - Address broad learning outcomes and for which there is a high cost – e.g. school social events, excursions, camps, carnivals, etc. A maximum cost for each of these has been listed, and parents only pay if students take part. These costs, which may be less than the maximum cost indicated, will be collected throughout the year as the activities arise.

3. Voluntary Approved Requests

*Students may purchase additional printer credits once they have used their allowance at rate of \$5.00 per 50 black and white copies. Colour copies are 60 cents per page.

Student Welfare Support Voluntary Approved Request

The 'Student Welfare Support' component of the voluntary approved request allows the Student Services Team to purchase items for students in need and is primarily utilised by the school Chaplain as needs may arise. There is no cost for students to visit the members of the Student Services Team, which includes the School Psychologist, School Nurse, and the school Chaplain.

Parents & Citizens Voluntary Approved Request

The Denmark Senior High School P&C voluntary approved request has been set at \$50.00 per student. Please note that any donation up to this amount will be gratefully accepted. If you would like input into where the donations are spent, please consider becoming a member and attend meetings. The P&C meets regularly in the staffroom and dates of upcoming meetings are circulated via the school newsletter, school website and emails to parents. The financial year for the P&C is 1st July-30th June; with the AGM being held in October.

Payment of Contributions and Charges

Payments can be made at any time to the front office during school office hours. Our office is open Monday to Friday 8.30am-3.30pm. Payments can be made by mail (cheque only), in person via cash, cheque or credit card. We accept MasterCard, VISA and EFTPOS.

Allowances and Subsidies - Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS):

The Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) is available to parents/guardians with children enrolled in secondary schooling who hold an eligible concession card. The SAS comprises of an Education Program Allowance which is paid to the school and a Clothing Allowance that is paid to the parent. (If the student is enrolled in a public school, the parent may nominate the clothing allowance be paid to the school).

Only students in full time secondary education in Years 7-12 may be eligible. At the time of publication, we expect the

- SAS scheme to pay \$235 under the “Educational Program Allowance” towards voluntary contributions in Years 7-10 and assist with course charges in Years 11 and 12.
- An additional \$115 Clothing Allowance can be claimed by the parent or guardian.

The allowance is available to parents/guardians of secondary students if the parent is a holder of:

- Pensioner Concession Card, or
- Health Care Card (Not children’s concession card which has been issued for medical purposes) or
- Department of Veterans Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

Parents of students in receipt of Department of Human Services (Centrelink) ABSTUDY are only eligible for the ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance.

Please note: Students holding their own cards are ineligible to claim this allowance unless they provide appropriate evidence from Centrelink validating, they are an Independent Youth. Cards held must be current for at least 4 weeks in first term of 2024. **Application forms can be obtained and completed via the administration office at the school.** Please bring your card with you as we are required to send a copy with the application.

Specialised Basketball Program

The Basketball Program attracts a charge of \$60.00 per semester, which is a compulsory charge. The program replaces one elective courses on your child's timetable.

Specialist Music Program

Specialist music attracts a compulsory charge of \$30 per annum in year 7 and 8 respectively. In years 9 and 10 there is a voluntary annual contribution of \$15 and a compulsory charge of \$5 per semester. The funds collected are used for the purchase text books, instrument upkeep and classroom resources. The program replaces one elective courses on your child's timetable.
